

Crochet Witch Hat

Difficulty: Easy

What you'll need:

Size "J" (6.00MM) Hook

Medium (4) Worsted Weight Yarn in the following colors:

Black

Dark Purple

Stitches you'll use:

ch—chain stitch

sl st—slip stitch

sc—single crochet

dc—double crochet

dc2tog—double crochet two stitches together or dc decrease stitch

Hat

ch 3, sl st to join and create a loop (or create a magic loop instead)

Rnd 1) ch 2, 3 sc in center loop, sl st in 2nd ch st (from the start of the rnd.)

Rnd 2) ch 2, sc in next 3 st, sl st in 2nd ch st.

Rnd 3) ch 2, 2 sc in next st, sc in next st, 2 sc in last st, sl st in 2nd ch st.

Rnd 4) ch 2, sc in next 5 st, sl st in 2nd ch st.

Rnd 5) repeat rnd 4.

Rnd 6) ch 2, sc in next, *2sc in next, sc in next, repeat from * one more time, sl st in 2nd ch st.

Rnd 7) ch 2, sc in each st around, sl st in 2nd ch st.

Rnd 8) repeat rnd 7.

Rnd 9) ch 2, sc in next, *2sc in next, sc in next, repeat from * two more times, sl st in 2nd ch st.

Rnd 10-11) repeat rnd 7.

Rnd 12) ch 2, sc in next 2 st, 2sc in next, *sc in next 2, 2sc in next, repeat from * one more time, sc in last st, sl st in 2nd ch st.



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Rnd 13-14) repeat rnd 7.

Rnd 15) ch 2, *sc in next 2 st, 2sc in next st, repeat from * three more times, sc last st, sl st in 2nd ch st.

Rnd 16-17) repeat rnd 7.

Rnd 18) ch 2, *sc in next 3 st, 2sc in next, repeat from * three more times, sc in last st, sl st in 2nd ch st.

Rnd 19-20) repeat rnd 7.

Rnd 21) ch 2, *sc in next 3 st, 2sc in next st, repeat from * four more times, sc in last st, sl st in 2nd ch st.

Rnd 22-23) repeat rnd 7.

Rnd 24) ch 2, *sc in next 4 st, 2sc in next st, repeat from * four more times, sc in last st, sl st in 2nd ch st.

Rnd 25-26) repeat rnd 7.

Rnd 27) ch 2, *sc in next 4 st, 2sc in next st, repeat from * five more times, sc in last st, sl st in 2nd ch st.

Rnd 28-29) repeat rnd 7.

Rnd 30) ch 2, *sc in next 5 st, 2sc in next st, repeat from * five more times, sc in last st, sl st in 2nd ch st.

Rnd 31-32) repeat rnd 7.

Rnd 33) ch 2, *sc in next 5 st, 2sc in next st, repeat from * six more times, sl st in 2nd ch st.

Rnd 34-35) repeat rnd 7.

Rnd 36) ch 2, *sc in next 6 st, 2sc in next st, repeat from * six more times, sl st in 2nd ch st.

Rnd 37-38) repeat rnd 7.

Rnd 39) ch 2, *sc in next 6 st, 2sc in next st, repeat from * seven more times, sl st in 2nd ch st.

Rnd 40-41) repeat rnd 7.

Rnd 42) ch 2, *sc in next 8 st, 2sc in next st, repeat from * six more times, sc in last st, sl st in 2nd ch st.

Rnd 43-44) repeat rnd 7.

Rnd 45) ch 2, *sc in next 8 st, 2sc in next st, repeat from * six more times, sc in next 7 st, 2sc in last st, sl st in 2nd ch st.

Rnd 46-47) repeat rnd 7.

Rnd 48) ch 2, *sc in next 8 st, 2sc in next st, repeat from * seven more times, sc in next 6 st, 2sc in last st, sl st in 2nd ch st.

Rnd 49) ch 2, sc in each st around, sl st in 2nd ch st.

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Rnd 50-59) repeat rnd 49.

Rnd 60) ch 2, 2sc in each st around, sl st in 2nd ch st.

Rnd 61-62) ch 2, sc in each st around, sl st in 2nd ch st.

Finish off.

Note: This hat can be made for any size.

For a **LARGER** size:

Just continue to add rows of: [ch 2, *sc in next 8 st, 2sc in next st* around, sl st in 2nd ch st.] until it's as large as you need it, then continue on to row 49 where you'll add the length needed. Then finish the brim as described in rounds 60-62.

For a **SMALLER** size:

Simply stop increasing by row when you get to the width you need the hat. Then add the length in round 49 for as long as you need it. The brim comes last (rounds 60-62).

Purple Band:

Row 1) ch 77, dc in 4th ch from hook, dc in each st across, ch 3 and turn.

Row 2) dc in next st, dc in next 7 st, dc2tog, *dc in next 8 st, dc2tog, repeat from * five more times, dc in next 4 st, ch 3 and turn.

Row 3) dc in next st, dc in next 7 st, dc2tog, *dc in next 8 st, dc 2 tog, repeat from * four more times, dc in next 7 st.

Finish off.

To make the band larger, add to the initial chain and follow the pattern [*dc in 8 st, dc2tog*]

To make the band smaller, subtract stitches from the initial chain and do the same.

I laced the ends of the band together with a piece of purple yarn and tied a bow at the end. Then I pulled the band over the top of the hat, down to the position that looked best. Make sure to line up the bow with the back of the witch's hat.



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You're finished! Give yourself a pat on the back!
